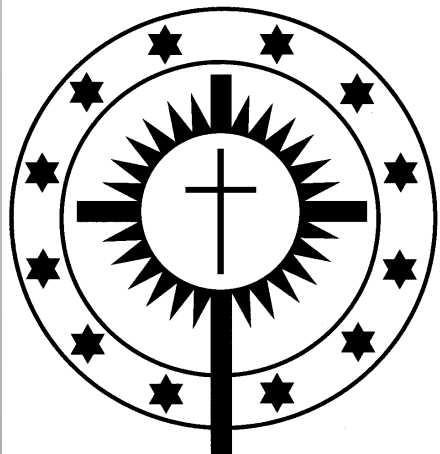

GENERAL INFORMATION

The YOUTH 2000 Retreat will be held Friday through Sunday, February 26-28, 2010, at the *Bishop O'Connor Catholic Pastoral Center* in Madison, WI. All youth and young adults, ages 13-30 are invited. If you have any questions after reading the following information, please call (608) 821-3160.

REGISTRATION

The Registration Form and Liability Release are enclosed. **All participants, including chaperones, must complete the Liability Release Form.** All forms for participants age 17 and younger must be signed by a parent or legal guardian and must be completed in advance of the weekend. Participants are encouraged to pre-register. Participants who wait to register at the door must have Liability Release and Registration Forms signed by a parent or legal guardian and will only be allowed entrance if space is available. Return completed registration forms by Friday, February 19. The registration fee is **\$40 per person**. All chaperones must submit proof of compliance with Diocesan requirements for providing a safe and secure environment for minors (see below). Additional donations to help offset the costs are gratefully accepted.

CHAPERONES

There must be one adult chaperone, age 21 and over, for every one to seven youth under the age of 18. Parent/guardian assumes the responsibility for finding a chaperone. Chaperones must arrive with, attend and stay with their youth during the Retreat. All chaperones and volunteers must fulfill and be in compliance with their Diocesan policies and requirements for providing a safe and secure environment for minors. All chaperones must provide a *Compliance With Diocese of Madison Safe Environment Policies Form* confirming their compliance with diocesan policies and procedures. Send chaperone form, \$40 registration fee and compliance form with participants' forms and fees.

LOCATION

The *Bishop O'Connor Catholic Pastoral Center* (BOCPC) is located at 702 S. High Point Rd., Madison, WI 53719 (see map).

MEALS

Lunch, dinner and a drink with each meal will be provided on Saturday. The cost for these two meals is included in the \$40 registration fee. Leaving the site for these meals is not an option.

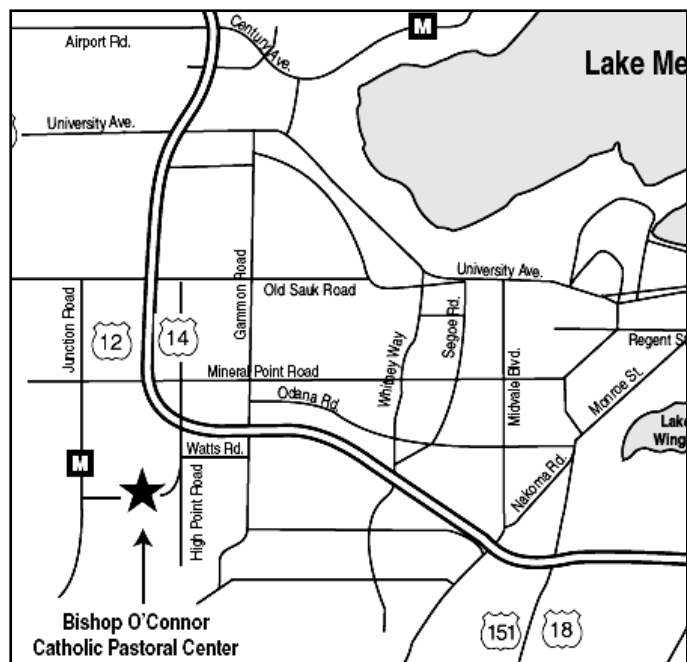

From the North and West:

Take Hwy 12/18 (Beltline) east to the Mineral Point Rd exit. Exit east (left). Take Mineral Point Rd to High Point Rd (a stoplight) and turn south (right). Take High Point Rd approximately 1 mile to the entrance of the O'Connor Center. The entrance is on the west (right).

From East and South:

Take Hwy 12/18/14/151 (Beltline) west to the Gammon Rd exit. Exit south (left). Take Gammon Rd south to Watts Rd (the first intersection). Turn west (right) on Watts Rd to High Point Rd (first stoplight) and turn south (left). Take High Point Rd approximately 500 feet to the entrance of the O'Connor Center. The entrance is on the west (right).

From Interstate 90:

Take Madison Exit 142 (Hwy 12/18/14/151 - Beltline) west. Proceed about 12 miles west to the Gammon Rd exit. Exit south (left). Take Gammon Rd south to Watts Rd (the first intersection). Turn west (right) on Watts Rd to High Point Rd (first stoplight) and turn south (left). Take High Point Rd approximately 500 feet to the entrance of the O'Connor Center. The entrance is on the west (right).
